Tim opened the meeting using prayer from the service.

Mark moved to approve minutes from previous meeting. Karen seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

There was no Treasurer's or Dofflemyer report. Motion was made for 3rd Quarter Thank Offering to go to the Children's Backpack Ministry. Mark moved. David seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Pastor Phyllis gave Pastor's report

Committee Reports:

Property: Tim mentioned that tenants in the parsonage have indicated that they will be leaving in October when the lease is up. Tom moved to continue lease as is for next go round. Mark seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Larry and Tim also mentioned that the mowing bill for the church is up to date and that the Air Conditioner is functioning. Council also moved with no discussion to dispose of the broken weed-eater. Tom suggested the possibility of putting in a half-bath/full-bath or partial bath on the sanctuary floor. Larry made a motion to form a committee to study the feasibility of such a project as to cost, labor, time etc. Tom seconded. Council passed unanimously.

Music and Worship: Work continues on finding Leola some relief for certain Sundays. (And we thank Leola for her continuing dedicated service!) Pastor Phyllis has advertised for musicians around town and has talked to Sharon Henry at St. Luke about using some of their music when Leola is off. Pastor Phyllis will be out of town on the 31st of August. Tim will lead the service that day. Council also discussed the idea of buying or creating new banners to replace ones that have been worn or damaged.

Fellowship: Homecoming is set for August 24th, 2014. Lemonade will be offered for the Rt. 340 Yard Sale Crawl at the church. Yellow tags were placed on certain items that Pastor Phyllis thinks could find another home and make St. Peter's a little more welcoming and open the door for the future of the church. Larry offered to create a sign using his contact information offering free yard sale space (donations to the church will

be accepted) to anyone needing it for the Crawl. All at council were in agreement with this.

Unfinished Business: Pastor Phyllis is continuing to work on a Christian Education "Parents Night Out". The program would allow for parents to have a "night out" while their children would be involved in a Christian Education program through the church. This will occur once a month and will include Pizza, a Bible Story, and Crafts for the children who participate. Pastor Phyllis inquired whether Dofflemyer funds could be used to pay for this when it gets off the ground. Anticipated starting date would be in October.
